



KSA RIGHT OF WAY PROTOCOLS

Freestyle & Public Sessions

By participating, all skaters and coaches agree to these protocols.

General Safety

Skate defensively. Stay aware of your surroundings and other skaters at all times. All skaters skate at their own risk.

Skill levels vary. Be aware that skaters of all abilities share the ice. If a collision occurs, check on everyone involved. Report injuries to the front desk immediately.

In an emergency, call 9-1-1 and notify and notify the front desk.

Traffic Flow

Skate counterclockwise. The standard flow around the outer perimeter is counterclockwise — from the entrance, turn right.

Merging onto the ice? Always check the flow of traffic from any direction before entering.

Going against traffic? You and your coach are responsible for avoiding accidents with skaters in the conventional pattern.

Right of Way — Who Goes First

When paths cross, yield to skaters in this order:

1st. A skater in the middle of a spin.

2nd. A skater performing their program to overhead music (during the first 2 plays of their song).

3rd. A skater traveling in the conventional (counterclockwise) traffic pattern on the perimeter.

During Public Sessions: A general public skater who is not training or taking lessons always has right of way priority.

Special Situations

Pole harness lessons. Give extra space to coaches working with pole harnesses — they have limited mobility. Coaches using pole harnesses must still follow all right of way rules.

Clear jump & spin zones promptly. Once your jump or spin is done, move out of the designated area quickly so others can use it. (See facility map.)

Instruction: While giving and receiving instruction standing still. You must be by the boards behind the learning line.

Violations

Violating these protocols may result in removal from the ice, suspension from sessions, or other consequences as determined by management.
