



## **FREESTYLE AND PUBLIC SESSION RULES AND POLICIES**

BY PARTICIPATING IN A FREESTYLE OR PUBLIC SESSION, ALL SKATERS, COACHES, GUESTS AND SPECTATORS ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THEY UNDERSTAND AND AGREE TO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. Skate safely and responsibly during all sessions. Remember, Freestyle sessions are primarily for teaching and training and Public Sessions are for all guests, especially new skaters beginning to experience and learn the joy of skating.
2. Choose the appropriate skating session for your abilities. Management reserves the right to remove a skater from a session if necessary or appropriate.
3. All skaters must abide by the right of way priority listing and the jump and spin zones safety map, each as set forth in the Right of Way Protocol.
4. It is strongly recommended that all skaters observe the conventional travel pattern set forth in the Right of Way Protocol Rules and Policies. If a skater diverts from the conventional travel pattern, they are responsible for avoiding accidents or collisions.
5. Only approved coaches that have executed the Private Ice-Skating Coach Facility Use Agreement may provide direct coaching and instruction to skaters. To avoid distracting other skaters and coaches, all non-instruction conversation must occur in the lobby or equivalent off-ice area in the facility.
6. No coach is permitted to organize or teach a group of more than 4 skaters without permission from Management.
7. The entrance to the ice surface must always be clear and no guest, parent, skater, or coach may block the entrance at any time and the door needs to remain shut.
8. No skater is permitted to use an audio headset (headphones, earbuds, or anything the functions in a similar manner) while skating without express permission from Management.
9. Coaches may use handheld music speakers for their students. Music played from a handheld speaker by a coach must be at a moderate volume that is no louder than the overhead speakers and does not disturb other skaters.
10. The order in which music may be played on the overhead speakers utilizing rink music system only.
11. Lyrics of any song played in a manner to be heard by the public, either on the overhead speakers or a coach's handheld speaker, must be appropriate for families and children. Management can require a song to be turned off for inappropriate lyrics.
12. No skater is permitted to use any video recorder or any other camera (including but not limited to smartphones, go-pro cameras, or other similar device) while skating without express permission from Management.
13. Parents, coaches, and guests may record (both audio and/or visual) only the skater which they have accompanied to the Facility. Recording any other person is prohibited.
14. Skaters may only review video footage of their routine in the lobby or equivalent off-ice area in the facility.
15. Coaches shall display a positive attitude about the Facility and it's programming, as well as the Ice Skating Profession. Coaches shall promote the Operator's internal programs, USFS Governing Body, and USFS. The Coaches are expected to introduce skaters and their parents to the Operator's Programs and encourage involvement in volunteer activities, exhibitions, shows, competitions, and other program events.
16. Skaters, speak to your coach before exiting the ice while a freestyle session is in progress.
17. All skaters, coaches, and guests are required to comply with the Venue Rules, USFS Skate Safe,

US Center for SafeSport, and USA Hockey guidelines and rules at all times.

Violation of the Freestyle and Public Session Rules and Policies, the Venue Rules, the Right of Way Protocols, or any other rules, regulations, or policies set forth by the Operator may result in removal from the rink surface during a session, suspension from the Freestyle and Public Sessions, or any other consequence Management deems appropriate for such violation.
